He is currently pursuing his PhD at the Crawford School of Public Policy, the Australian National University (ANU), focusing on Japan’s approach toward Asian regionalism during the post-Cold War period. He acquired Bachelor in Law, Waseda University, Tokyo and Master of Arts in International Politics, the University of Warwick, the United Kingdom.
