### 100th Anniversary of Diplomatic Relations Between Iran and Hungary

### **Keynote Speaker**

**Miklós Sárközy**, a historian and an Iranist, holds a PhD in Iranian Studies (title of thesis: The history of Tabaristan in the early-Islamic period before the Mongols). He is an Associate Professor at the Károli Gáspár University of the Reformed Church in Hungary, where he teaches courses related to the ancient Middle East and Central Asia, Parthian and Sasanid Persia, Iranian studies – among others. He has worked and studied abroad, e. g. at the Institute of Ismaili Studies, London or the Toshkent Davlat Sharqshunoslik Universiteti, and has participated in several research projects, among others on the sources of Hungarian-Iranian relations at the Hungarian Academy of Arts (2019-2022). His most recent book - The Early Nizari Ismailis and their Neighbouring Powers - Politics in the Caspian Provinces – was published in 2024 by the I.B.Tauris.

# 100th Anniversary of Diplomatic Relations Between Chile and Hungary Roundtable Participants

Emőke Horváth is a historian and Latin Americanist, Associate Professor at the Institute of History at Károli Gáspár University of the Reformed Church in Hungary, and head of the university's Latin America Research Group. She earned her degree and PhD from Eötvös Loránd University, pursued doctoral studies at the University of Valladolid, and received a prestigious State Eötvös Scholarship to conduct dissertation research at King's College London, under the supervision of Janet Nelson. Between 2005 and 2010, she led three European Union-funded academic programs - CLIOHRES.net, CLIOHNET2, and CLIOH-WORLD - on behalf of the University of Miskolc, serving as a board member during the final two years. Her primary research interests include the history of Cuba during the Cold War, the role of the Church following the Cuban Revolution, and Hungarian Chilean relations during the same period. More recently, her work has focused on the history of Hungarian Latin American foreign relations, with special attention to Chile and Cuba. She has conducted archival research in Hungary, Chile, and Cuba. She has taught at several international universities, including Stockholm, Siegen, Adana, and Oradea, and is a regular presenter at both national and international academic conferences. She is an author of numerous books and studies on Latin American topics. She serves on the editorial board of Ad Americam. She is also the series editor of Bibliotheca Americana at L'Harmattan Publishing and serves on the editorial board of the Journal of American Studies, published by Jagiellonian University.

**Gabriella Thomázy** holds a PhD in Military Sciences with an educational background in Sociology, Human Resource Management, and Education. She completed her doctoral studies at the Doctoral School of Military Sciences at the University of Public Service, specializing in Security Studies. She is currently a Senior Lecturer at the Department of International Relations and Diplomacy at Ludovika University of Public Service in Budapest. She lived in Chile for almost ten years, where she studied benefit management at the Pontifical Catholic University of Chile and worked in various professional roles. During her time in Chile, she actively participated in several projects of the Hungarian Embassy in Santiago. She remains an active member of the Hungarian community there. Her research focuses on migration, South America, and security studies. She has presented her work at numerous conferences in Hungary and abroad (including Colombia, Finland, and Spain) and has been an invited speaker and guest lecturer at several universities, including Eötvös Loránd University (Hungary), Corvinus University of Budapest (Hungary), the University of Chile, and the Chilean Military Academy. She is a board member of the Security Policy Division of the Hungarian Association of Military Science.

### **Keynote Speakers**

**Gabriel Gaspar** studied law at the University of Chile Law School and graduated in Political Science from FLACSO Mexico. He specializes in Latin American studies and international and defense issues. He is a full professor at the Autonomous Metropolitan University (Iztapalapa) in Mexico. He is an associate professor at the National Autonomous University of Mexico (UNAM). He has taught at the Andrés Bello Diplomatic Academy and at the War Academies in Chile. He has served as Undersecretary of War, Undersecretary of the Armed Forces, and Undersecretary of Defense in the administrations of Presidents Ricardo Lagos, Michelle Bachelet, and Gabriel Boric. He was Chilean Ambassador to Colombia from 2006 to 2008. Chilean Ambassador to Cuba from 2009 to 2010. He was Ambassador on Special Mission to Bolivia's Maritime Claim (2015 to 2018).

**Jorge Homero Arellano Lascano** former Ambassador of Ecuador to Chile (2014-2016; 2017-2021); he led Ecuador's security as Coordinating Minister of Security (2010-2014), during which time he created and implemented the ECU-911 Integrated Security System. As Secretary General of the Vice Presidency of Ecuador (2008-2010), he promoted "Manuela Espejo" Solidarity Mission, the first biopsychosocial-clinical-genetic study of people with disabilities in the country. As an Admiral, he rose to the position of Commander General of the Navy (2006-2007). Due to his technical and scientific training, he built close relations with the Republic of Chile, where he participated as a pioneer in the Ecuadorian Antarctic Program (1983, 1987, 1990). He subsequently served as a visiting professor at the Chilean Navy's Naval War College (1992-1993) and, years later, as Naval Attaché at the Ecuadorian Embassy in Chile (1999-2001). He also served as a visiting professor and researcher at the Chilean National Academy of Political and Strategic Studies (ANEPE).

**Viktor Marsai**, PhD, graduated from Eötvös Loránd University (ELU) in 2008 with a double major in history and aesthetics. He went on to earn a postgraduate degree in security and defense policy from Zrínyi Miklós National Defense University in 2010 while already pursuing a PhD at the ELU Doctoral School of History. He defended his dissertation about state building in Somalia and obtained his PhD in spring 2014. He worked for the Hungarian Ministry of Defense in 2010-2011. Marsai joined the faculty of the National University of Public Service (NUPS) in 2012 as a junior lecturer, subsequently promoted to assistant professorship. He has also served as an adjunct lecturer at Pázmány Péter Catholic University since 2014. In March 2017 he became the leader of the "Africa in the globalized world" Ludovika Research Group at NUPS. The same year he won the János Bolyai Research Scholarship of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences. He started working part-time at MRI on 1 September 2017, he was appointed research director in October 2019. He has served as executive director of the institute since summer 2022. His main areas of research are migration processes on the African continent and the security aspects of migration.

**István Tarrósy** is a Full Professor of Political Science at the Department of Political Science and International Studies, University of Pecs (UP), Hungary, and Visiting Professor at Jagiellonian University in Kraków, Poland. He also directs the Hungarian Africa Research Center and is head of the Doctoral Program in International Politics at UP. He was a Japan Foundation Fellow at Ryukoku University in 2010, and a Fulbright Visiting Scholar at the Center for African Studies (CAS) of the University of Florida in 2013-14. He is member of the China–Africa Working Group at CAS and Courtesy Affiliate Professor at the Center for Arts, Migration and Entrepreneurship (CAME). He is coconvenor of the Collaborative Research Group 'Africa in the World' of AEGIS African Studies in Europe. His research interests include Afro-Asian relations, China–Africa dynamics, the international relations and geopolitics of Sub-Saharan Africa and global African migrations. He is Editor-in-Chief of the Hungarian Journal of African Studies

**Aadi Rajesh** is a strong believer in the philosophy of lifelong learning. He completed his bachelor's degree at Eötvös Loránd University (ELTE) in Budapest, and his master's degree at the University of Pannonia in Veszprém, specializing in International Relations and Security Studies. He is currently a Phd student at the Ludovika University of Public Service in Budapest, where his research focuses on India-Africa relations in the 21st century.


