In exceptional cases, the organizing committee may allow online presentations if the presenter resides abroad (supported by written proof), studies at a foreign institution (in which case no documentation is required), or under other justified circumstances.

Abstracts must be submitted in both English and the language of the presentation. Each abstract should be 150–200 words long and include 5 keywords. If the presentation is in Hungarian, the abstract must also be submitted in English. In both cases, the 150–200-word limit applies.

All abstracts will be subject to a review process. Negative reviews may result in the rejection of the application.

Each presentation will be allotted **15 minutes**, followed by **5 minutes** for questions and discussion.
